

# HEAD-ON CRASH INJURES EIGHT

LEHI, Nov. 9—Four men, two of them Salt Lakers, were in serious condition Saturday at Lehi and American Fork hospitals after a head-on crash on U. S. highway 91 near Lehi Friday night.

The victims are Howard Whimpey, about 27, of 123 West Sixth South street, Salt Lake City, driver of an eastbound automobile; Don Onthank, 22, same address; Mark (Tom) Featherstone, 42, Lehi, and Dave Mitchell, 42, also of Lehi, passengers in the Whimpey car.

## Skull Fracture Received

Mitchell suffered a skull fracture and crushed chest. Whimpey suffered a broken leg and broken arm. They were taken to the American Fork hospital.

Onthank sustained a possible fractured neck, broken ankle and deep lacerations, while Featherstone's injuries included a possible skull fracture. Both were in Lehi hospital.

## Truck Involved

State Highway Patrolmen Milvin Grant and O. H. Beardall and Lehi City Marshals Arley Clark and Thomas Triniman said the automobile, traveling on the wrong side of the highway, crashed into a westbound truck near the Lehi hospital about 9:10 p. m. Friday.

The truck was operated by Denzil Turner, 34, Lehi, who suffered several deep cuts and severe bruises. With him were his wife, Mrs. Isetta Turner, 33; their daughter, Mary Jane, three years old, and Miss Thea Wright, 31, also of Lehi. They were treated at American Fork hospital for minor cuts and bruises.
